DO YOU KNOW WHAT A **CRANBERRY IS?**

IT IS A SMALL, ROUND, RED FRUIT BERRY THAT GROWS ON LONG VINES.

> Many families started growing cranberries **MORE THAN 200** YEARS AGO.

Did you know the cranberry is named after a crane?

A long time ago German and Dutch settlers thought the flower that grows on the cranberry vine looked like the head and bill of a bird called a crane. They called them "crane berries." Isn't that funny?!

OR

In the United States. cranberries are grown in Massachusetts, New Jerseu, Wisconsin, Washington and Oregon.

Cranberries were eaten at the first Thanksgiving in Plymouth, Massachusetts.

Cranberries were one of the first fruits to grow in North America. The others are blueberries and Concord (purple) grapes.

> Cranberries are perennial plants. That means they get planted one time and grow back every year. Some cranberry plants are more than 100 years old and still produce fruit!







Cranberries are harvested in the fall.



In the fall, some farmers flood their bogs with water so the cranberries float to the top and can be harvested.




Farmers use tractors called eggbeaters, booms and rakes to harvest cranberries. (We will learn more about this in lesson 3.)

Each cranberry has four tiny air pockets inside. The pockets allow it to float on top of water.

THERE ARE ABOUT 450 CRANBERRIES IN ONE POUND.



Cranberries are used to make more than 1,000 foods like juice, dried fruit and cranberry sauce.








