

“I am motivated to capture the complexities of experiences concerning the tension between fragility and strength, trauma and renewal, and tenderness and violence. My work grapples with the emotional exhaustion and psychological strain of caring for a child in a patriarchal society. I cut up canvas to reconstruct the painting by sewing, attaching and arranging found objects and building materials into corporeal assemblages. Bodily forms are disatored, destroyed and rebuilt to dismantle the normalization of oppression and counter hegemony. This reconstruction responds to living in an “othered” body, a female identifying body, a Latinx body, one reclaiming agency.”

Sophie Canadé is a Registered Art therapist (ATR) and a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC). She has been working with Gilda's Club Chicago since 2014. Through GCC, Sophie facilitates therapeutic art visits with people getting care from Northwestern Memorial Hospital and Advocate Christ Medical Center. She also facilitates virtual weekly creative programming, and special events such as this art show. Sophie is a founding member of the PO Box Arts & Healing Collective in Rogers Park, where, just like at Gilda's Club, an individual's health is supported by community. She sees that to be "well," every aspect of a person must be tended, the social, emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual.



Art Facilitator; Vanessa Bueno MAAT



Vanessa Bueno has graduated from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago with her Master's degree in Art Therapy. She interned at Gilda's Club Chicago beginning in the fall of 2022 and is currently facilitating Community Art. Now that she has graduated, she plans to work through a community-based approach to provide mental health services for marginalized communities who are underserved to provide access to resources that support their overall well-being. She is a working artist who found that art can be used for growth, fun, communication, connection, healing, transformation, and relaxation. As an art therapist, she has found that art-making can be a form of expression and processing. During her time at Gilda's Club Chicago, she learned from members how to utilize watercolor, found objects, and many other art materials in innovative ways. This was accomplished through joint learning, collaboration, skill sharing, and capacity building.
